


OCT. 10 - 20, 2022

RESPONDING TO OUR BLESSINGS

This Sunday's readings explore how we see and respond to blessing in our lives. We hear two stories of healing and of thanksgiving, of a powerful military leader Naaman, and of a powerless Samaritan leper. Both are examples of humility and gratitude that mark the presence of faith in God. We observe that both Naaman and the leper had their horizons expanded by their healing. Once healed, they did not simply attribute this to a stroke of luck, and then go on with their lives. Instead, they began to see God on the move, reaching out to everyone, and actively blessing all creation. Jesus notes that the leper's faith saved him, because he was receptive to seeing this fuller reality. Faith changes our perception. Faith allows us to see beyond our usual boundaries, to embrace a loving God, and to participate in sharing that love with others.

THE OTHER

Saint Luke has a special interest in Samaritans. In Luke and in Acts, Samaritans keep popping up, both in parable and in the narrative. In today's Gospel, Jesus travels among peoples with a long history of hostilities between those loyal to the Temple in Jerusalem, and those (Samaritans) who rejected it. They shared many common beliefs, and honored the God of Abraham and Moses. As in many conflicts, two groups who have much in common tragically have the most intense disagreements.

It was the Samaritan leper who returned to thank Jesus and praise God for his healing. Someone across the social divide became an example of faith in God, just as, earlier in Luke, the Good Samaritan demonstrated love of neighbor. Might you be part of a group that finds reasons to distrust another group? Jesus points toward new possibilities within and between families, ethnicities, and religious groups. If "the other" is in fact admirable, if we can learn from them, then perhaps we can work to be reconciled with them.

GOD'S WAYS

The passage from 2 Kings concludes of the story of Naaman, a foreign military leader who suffers from a skin disease named as leprosy. The full story of Naaman is well worth reading, beginning in 2 Kings 5:1, as it describes the journey of a powerful man desperate for a cure, and who finds it most unexpectedly. He has used up all the options available to the wealthy and well-connected. But his slave girl from Israel points him to Elisha, the little-known Jewish prophet. Other servants rescue Naaman from his pride, and he is led to accept healing.

This story illustrates how God's ways are different from worldly ways. God acts primarily through the lowly and faithful, while power and wealth fail to solve the world's problem. Those on the margins, or those with humility, are often best able to see the opportunities God makes available. When Naaman humbled himself, he discovered God's ways, and gave thanks to God.



Novena for All Souls

Our Lady of the Holy Souls Catholic Church

October 25 - November 2

In honor of our Parish's Feast Day, All Souls Day, we will offer a Novena for All Souls. The Novena will be offered at each of the already scheduled Masses each day. Everyone is invited to be part of this Novena.

PICTURES OF YOUR DECEASED LOVED ONES

On this feast day, we remember our deceased loves ones. As a special way to remember them, we invite everyone to bring pictures of their deceased loves ones. The pictures must be no larger than 5"x7", in a frame, and brought to the Church Office no later than October 21. The Church Office staff will place these pictures around the altar before the novena begins. The picture will remain in front of the altar until Nov. 2nd; then you will be able to pick it up in the church office. **Please do not take your framed pictures from the Shrine in the Adoration Chapel; you will need to bring an additional picture.**

SPECIAL MASS INTENTIONS FOR NOVENA

During the Novena, special Mass Intentions will be offered for deceased loved ones. Everyone is invited to put the names of those whom you would like to be remembered at all the Novena Masses. The envelopes are available now at the Church doors or in the Church Office. These envelopes will be placed in a basket on the altar during the Novena.

Why is a Novena 9 Days?

There are a few reasons why the number nine might be significant.

The first comes from the Acts of the Apostles, when Jesus told His disciples to gather together and pray after His Ascension into Heaven. Tradition tells us that the Apostles, along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, went to the Upper Room and prayed together for the nine days between Jesus' Ascension (believed to have been 40 days after His Passion/Passover) and Pentecost.

Another reason could be that nine is significant because of the nine months that Mary carried Jesus in her womb. In fact, people in the Middle Ages traditionally spent nine days in prayer leading up to Christmas to signify the nine months that Jesus spent in the womb of His mother!



The Corporal Works of Mercy are: Feed the hungry, Give drink to the thirsty, Clothe the naked, Visit the imprisoned, Shelter the homeless, Visit the sick, and Bury the dead. *The Corporal Works of Mercy are acts of love that address the physical and material needs of others.* **The Spiritual Works of Mercy are:** Admonish the sinner. (Give correction to those who need it.) Instruct the ignorant. (Share our knowledge with others.) Counsel the doubtful. (Give advice to those who need it.) Comfort the sorrowful. (Comfort those who suffer.) Bear wrongs patiently. (Be patient with others.) Forgive all injuries. (Forgive those who hurt us.) Pray for the living and the dead. *The Spiritual Works of Mercy address the needs of peoples' minds, hearts, and souls.* Mercy is a theme found in Scripture in the Old Testament, but Jesus elevated our understanding of mercy in the New Testament. Jesus made it clear that a path of discipleship towards eternal life involves caring for others.

Living our Catholic faith requires us to serve one another. Using the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy are ways for all of us to follow the teachings of Jesus. We can live our Catholic faith by using our gifts, talents and treasure caring for others. Jesus met the needs of those he encountered. Even going as far as forgiving the criminal on the cross next to him at Calvary. He asks us to meet the needs of those who suffer. When we help those in need, we are really showing our love of Christ; we are taught he lives in every one of us through the Holy Spirit. He teaches us in Scripture: "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me," Mt 25:40.

As Catholic Christians, we all have a responsibility to be good stewards, to live our Catholic faith, to build the Kingdom of God, and to go and make disciples of all people. We can do this through kindness to others and through service to God and our community. Also through living as people who are willing to serve the needs of others and outwardly showing that we love the Lord. Actions do speak so much louder than words. We have opportunities at Holy Souls to serve our parish and others. We need Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Ushers, and Altar Servers. 


