## *Lent at Holy Souls*

It's hard to believe that Lent is already here! Wasn't it just Christmas? We are barely into Ordinary Time! Well, I don't know about you, but I love Lent and it's easy for me to see why many Catholic Saints observed two Lents and bypassed Advent altogether. There's something very powerful about the emptying of ourselves that occurs in Lent and how that draws us closer to Jesus in His suffering, death, and resurrection.

Leading a life of regular sacrifice and penance is one of my favorite things about being Catholic. What's even more remarkable to me about the Lenten process is not just that we don't merely participate in this yearly observance, but that we are DEEPENED each time we participate. We don't just perform these actions. These actions take root within us, and the love from which these sacrificial desires spring forth is also deepened. What used to be hard for us to do in Lent has likely become easier or will in the future.

In preparation for Lent and Easter, Fr. John asked me to say a few things about how our liturgies will change during Lent. Regardless of the liturgical seasons, the Sunday Liturgy is always a celebration. However, in Lent, due to the penitential aspect, we choose to quiet ourselves even in our liturgies and take on a more solemn tone. Some things you might observe at Mass in any Catholic church during Lent are as follows:

- No use of the word "Alleluia" in our liturgies -- don't worry, it will return at Easter.
- A less festive feel to liturgical music
- No musical solos during Mass -- all music should be sung in community (except for Laetare Sunday and other feasts and solemnities)
- The exclusion of the Gloria that we usually sing on Sundays. Again, this will return at Easter.
- The removal of flowers from the church.

In addition to these, here are more changes that Fr. John has initiated for Holy Souls this Lenten Season:

- Speaking of the Mass parts (Holy, Holy, Holy, Mystery of Faith, The Great Amen, and Lamb of God) instead of singing -- again, to make the change in tone more noticeable.
- Chanting of the Lenten Gospel Acclamation and the Our Father
- No special 10:30 choir anthems; simply all songs we can sing together.
- A visual display in front of the altar that will help guide our thoughts during Lent.
- New reading and devotional materials that can be picked up in the vestibule and taken home.
- Opening our Masses with the same song each week to carry a theme throughout the season.
- Ostinato Refrains -- the word "ostinato" means "a continually repeated refrain." At the beginning of Communion each Sunday, we will have a refrain that we sing to meditate during Communion. This is one of Fr. John's favorite forms of prayer and we will be using some from our hymnals and some from the Taize tradition, which is also very near and dear to Father.

I pray that we will all be obedient to the call to pray, sacrifice, and give alms this Lent, as a way to "decrease," so that the Lord may "increase." (John 3:30) We need to do this both personally and as a community. May our sacrifices unite us more closely with the Lord, but also with one another in humility, service, and love.

## *Grateful Stewards of God's Gifts . . .*

*At noon darkness came over the whole land until three o'clock in the afternoon. And at three o'clock Jesus cried out in a loud voice. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Some of the bystanders who heard it said, "Look he is calling Elijah." One of them ran, soaked a sponge with wine, put it on a reed, and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see if Elijah comes to take him down." Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last.*

*Mark 15:33-37*

In trying to understand the true power of stewardship, we need not look any further than the cross. It serves as a tremendous example of giving everything away freely for God and the people of God. Jesus answered the call, regardless of the cost, and the cost was life itself. Most of us will never have to sacrifice our lives in response to God's call. But there are Christians all across the globe that do every day. Missionaries have died due to violence or disease. Activists stood up for the basic rights of others and have lost their own right to live. Men and women who swore to keep the peace or rescue others from disaster have traded a lifetime with family and friends for the sake of the vulnerable. These people answered that call and responded with courage and commitment.

But even though our sacrifice might not be as great, it does not diminish the power in the response. Perhaps through our small everyday actions, someone will be touched by God and then transformed. It is not the size of the sacrifice that counts, but the complete willingness to give that sacrifice. Jesus' sacrifice is sufficient for the salvation of all humanity. Now, we are called to translate that reality into our own somewhat simple lives. On those days when being a good steward seems too difficult, look to the cross and find strength in a God who knows how hard this earthly life can be at times. An excerpt from *Everyday Stewardship*

What is the definition of a good steward? According to the US Bishops in their 1992 pastoral letter, "Stewardship: A Disciple's Response," a Christian Steward is "one who receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner, shares them in justice and love with others, and returns them with increase to the Lord." To put it more concisely, a good steward uses their gifts of time, talent and treasure for God and for others. Mother Teresa said, "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love." Even when we think we don't have great gifts and talents to share, we have something to offer. For example in a Bible Study class we attend, we may have an insight that will help one of the other participants. Donating gently used clothing for others or organizing items at Helping Hand. Our parish is always in need of Ushers, Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Eucharistic Minister Captains, Eucharistic Ministers to the Sick, Hospitality Ministers, Event Volunteers, Adult Youth Group Volunteers, Church Cleaning Volunteers, Handyman Volunteers, as well as other opportunities to serve. The Time and Talent form is on our Web Page or can be reviewed in the Guide Book that is mailed to every parishioners' home. It's our choice to be a good steward. It's our choice to encounter Jesus and to serve others.

# Building and Grounds

As we continue to address parking issues around the Campus of Holy Souls, we ask for your help. Many in Hillcrest and around the city with limited parking run into crowd issues during busy times. We have future planning for more parking, but until that is feasible and cost effective we are forced to do the best with what we currently have. We understand there are parking and traffic challenges quite often around Holy Souls, but we need to remind everyone to be courteous to one another and our neighbors. We respectfully ask that you always follow state parking and traffic laws as stated here: Never park or stop in fire lanes marked in red. Do not park in an intersection, on the corner of an intersection, or within 20 feet of an intersection. Do not park on a crosswalk. You are not allowed to park within 30 feet of stop signs. You should always park your vehicle in a place that is far enough from the street to avoid interfering with



traffic. Do not park within 15 feet of fire hydrants. It is illegal to block driveways, alleys, or private roads. Do not park or stop in a handicapped zone without a proper tag. You cannot block the curb access to sidewalks; these are walkways and pathways for pedestrians and handicapped. We have run into issues of people not respecting these spaces and laws. Holy Souls is subject to receiving fines and the vehicles may receive tickets or be towed.

So we take this opportunity to remind everyone to respect the laws and help us make sure all are following the rules.

Recently we offered shuttle service for the Christmas Masses, and some took advantage of that. If anyone feels like we should always offer a shuttle for busy times please let us know. This is something we would like to

continue if people will use it. Mt. St. Mary Academy generously offered the use of their front parking lots on Sundays when needed even if there is not a shuttle. That being only a block away is always an overflow option on nice weather days and to help us not overtake the neighborhood streets, which cause traffic flow problems. We would like to help alleviate the invasion and intrusiveness of vehicles to our neighbors. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

## *How Being Called and Gifted Changed My Life*

Four and half years ago I was in a job that was killing my faith life. It was long hours for little pay, a boss who didn't appreciate me, little to no time with my family, and lots of attacks on my faith. It was hard. I knew I needed a break and some time with God. The small flame I had inside me that was burning for God was only smoldering. I knew if I didn't take time to reconnect with Him my faith flame was in danger of going out. But life was so busy with a one year old and a husband preparing for medical school. How would I ever get away to spend time with the Lord?

Somehow I found this workshop in Memphis. It was all about discovering your "charisms" (gifts) that God had given you. These charisms were different than natural talent, or skill sets you've learned. Charisms were gifts from God used to help others and there was always abundant fruit associated with these gifts. The charisms that God gives you, can even direct you to the plan that God has in your life!

I was hooked! My job had me feeling burnt out, and I quickly realized why. None of the charisms God gave me I was using on a regular basis! I have a charism for Evangelization and Pastoring. I feel most alive and see lives change when I'm bringing people to know Jesus by pastoring and evangelizing small groups. My job didn't allow me to do that. Following this retreat I went home and quit.

It was scary. I knew I had to support my family while my husband was in medical school. We had just bought a house. I had a one year old daughter. What were we going to do?!

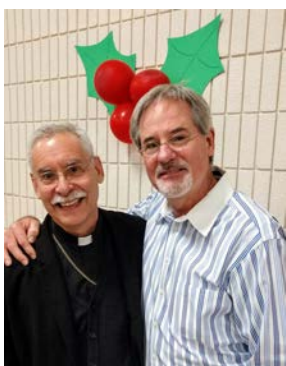
But it didn't matter because I could see with such clarity that God had called me to something special, and I trusted him to get me where I needed to be. As I was praying in my kitchen one morning I could sense God's presence and I just kept letting Him know how much I trusted him. I remember asking, "Lord, I will do what you ask. But how will this happen? How can I use these gifts of evangelizing and pastoring?" Just then I got a phone call from a friend I hadn't spoken with in a while. He let me know there was a job opening at Holy Souls for Director of Evangelization that would be pastoring small groups!

I hope each one of you considers getting involved with our Called & Gifted program. We just piloted with a good group of Holy Souls individuals who are on fire. It's easy to see why! Some have come to realize that they have an amazing charism of craftsmanship and that's why they love working with Holy Sews, others have come to see how when they operate in the gift of administration amazing things happen. Others have seen that their love for people was a charism for hospitality. Knowing God's plan for you is life changing. It gives you a sense of purpose and peace that is beyond all understanding. ## NURSERY

The Nursery is available in the Parish Hall for your young children (age 5 and younger) for all regular weekend Masses.

If you need to nurse your child during Mass, you may use the Gathering Room in Church. Please ask an usher to unlock the door for you.



What does it mean to have a Mass “offered” for someone? An individual may ask for a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for healing, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died).

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: first, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

When a person asks for a Mass to be offered for a particular intention; usually, a stipend is given to the priest for offering the Mass (suggested donation is \$10).

When we face the death of someone, even a person who is not Catholic, to have a Mass offered for the repose of his soul and to offer our prayers are more beneficial and comforting than any other sympathy card or bouquet of flowers.
